

NARFE State Convention Meets in Greensboro

The Greensboro, High Point, and Winston-Salem chapters will join in hosting the 54th Annual Convention of the North Carolina State NARFE Federation May 5-7 at the Embassy Suites in Greensboro. Some 200 members from across the state will meet to conduct the business of the Federation.

The convention opens with a special session to provide information on the benefits of NARFE membership to new or eligible non-members, followed by a number of workshops and a business session. Day one of the convention closes with a reception sponsored jointly by Blue Cross/Blue Shield Insurance and the three host chapters.

On May 6th, there will be more business sessions and the election of officers for the 2010-2011 fiscal year. In the evening, the banquet keynote speaker will be Joseph Beaudoin, NARFE National Vice-President. Vice-President Beaudoin will also take the opportunity at the banquet to install newly-elected officers for the new fiscal year. Entertainment at the banquet will be provided by Windfall, a trio of contemporary musicians providing classic hits.

On Friday morning, May 7th, there will be a final business session which will include a memorial service for members who have passed away since the 2009 convention. The final gavel of the convention will sound at approximately noon on Friday May 7.

New this year is the option of attending just the first day of the convention, May 5th. This "Commuters Special" registration is only \$15 and is intended to introduce current, new, and prospective members to the Convention experience. This option will allow participants to attend the newcomer's session, several informative workshops, Convention Business I, and the evening reception.

Our new Program Chair, Chris Huber, has scheduled some excellent presentations for our next three meetings:

March 11, 2010 - Linda Evans, Community Historian from the Greensboro Historical Museum. For several years she has been researching a new exhibit entitled "Voices of the City: Greensboro, North Carolina". The exhibit will open later this year and celebrates a diverse group of men and women who shaped our community from its founding in 1808 to the 21st century. Linda recently edited Greensboro's bicentennial calendar, accumulating facts and photos to celebrate the city's 200th year.

April 8, 2010 - Keith Francies, certified arborist and co-chair of the Urban Forestry Commission of the Greensboro Beautiful Board of Directors. Keith was a member of Greensboro's Tree Preservation Ordinance Committee and will discuss Greensboro's tree ordinance: its inception, its purpose, its team, its development, and its ability to assure that the natural growth in our community continues to thrive, beautifying our lives and benefiting all.

May 13, 2010 - Richard von Stamwitz, an author, motivational speaker and licensed professional counselor who will discuss attitude and role adjustment for the retiree.
